About: Columbus Metropolitan Library

Columbus Metropolitan Library (CML) has served the people of Franklin County, Ohio since 1873. With its Main Library and 22 branches, CML is well known for signature services and programs like Homework Help Centers, Reading Buddies, Summer Reading Challenge and Ready for Kindergarten. The library's Strategic Plan supports the vision of "a thriving community where wisdom prevails," which positions CML to respond to areas of urgent need: kids unprepared for kindergarten, third grade reading proficiency, high school graduation, college and career readiness and employment resources.

CML understands that great libraries create stronger communities. In recognition of the role of each branch as an essential hub that is reflective of the neighborhood it serves, CML began its aspirational building program- setting out to rebuild or renovate ten branches. With Phase I completed in summer 2019, the library is poised to look ahead to additional building and community needs. Phase II of the campaign will include a rebuild or renovation of the Gahanna, Hilltop, Karl Road, and Reynoldsburg branches.

The library is governed by an externally appointed board of seven community leaders who are responsible for guiding major decisions about library strategies and operations. The library's annual budget is supported through a local property tax levy and the state Public Library Fund.

About: Friends of the Columbus Metropolitan Library

Friends of the Library's (FOL) mission is to build awareness and resources to champion the vision of Columbus Metropolitan Library.

FOL is a non-profit, 501(c)4 organization with more than 1200 members and fans. The membership provides reach and resources beyond what the library can do on its own. It works closely with library leadership and staff to determine where its support can make a difference.

Through annual dues and entrepreneurial activities such as a gift shop, book sales, and cafes, FOL raises money to support CML programs and services. FOL is proud to fund critical programs such as Summer Reading Challenge, Homework Help Centers and Teen Read Week, all of which support the library's Young Minds strategy. Most importantly, FOL raises funds and advocates for the aforementioned library property tax levy campaign, which provides operational funding for the library.

About: Friends of the Library Board of Trustees

Friends of the Library is governed by a volunteer Board of Trustees consisting of 23 Board Members that are guided by an established Code of Regulations. The Director of

Strategic Initiatives & Advocacy and the Advocacy Associate, both of whom are Columbus Metropolitan Library employees, facilitate the strategic direction and daily activities of the FOL Board and organization.

The Board of Trustees meets six times a year to address a variety of agenda items. The Board's work is driven by four committees: Business, Community Relations, Finance, and Governance. Regular responsibilities include:

- Fiduciary responsibility for all funds raised through FOL lines of business, including oversight of vendor agreements and library café leases
- Continuous membership recruitment resulting in new Friends and Fans including the maintenance of social media accounts and hosting of events and programming
- Building a well-informed constituency that will respond to calls to action and advocate for legislative and ballot issues that impact the library
- Managing five Friends employees: a full-time Library Store Manager, two-part time Sales Associates, one part-time Warehouse Associate, and one part-time Administrative Assistant

About: Candidates for Friends of the Library Board

The FOL Board seeks to be inclusive of the diverse neighborhoods, ages, occupations, skills, and interests of the communities the library serves. Additionally, the Board must also possess the skills and expertise needed to complete its work:

- A passion for the library and its vital place in our community
- Knowledge of financial management practices and competencies
- Experience with entrepreneurial activities and retail operations
- Connections with the various communities and cultures served by the library
- Experience with membership recruitment, engagement, and retention
- Experience with grassroots advocacy and advocacy campaigns

About: Trustee Commitment

Trustees serve a three-year term for Board service, which can be renewed for two additional three-year terms for a maximum of nine years, unless the trustee is filling a vacancy, resigns, or is removed from office. The trustee is expected to prepare for and attend all Board meetings. Failure to attend three consecutive Board of Trustees meetings may be deemed cause for removal from office at the Board's discretion. Trustees are assigned to and expected to serve on at least one committee.

Trustees are asked to volunteer time for CML and FOL programs such as book sales, Summer Reading Challenge Kick-Off, and PBJ & Jazz, as well as events such as the

Celebration of Learning and Carnegie Author Series as they are able. Certain committee assignments or special projects may require additional time commitments above and beyond scheduled board and committee meetings. Board members are required to be a paid Friends of the Library member at a level that is personally meaningful and are encouraged to make additional contributions to the CML Foundation.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- The Board of Trustees will serve in accordance with the mission, values and Code of Regulations of Friends of the Library.
- The Board has fiduciary responsibility.
- The Board will provide strategic and fiscal oversight and guidance to Friends of the Library.
- The Board is responsible for maximizing long-term value of Friends of the Library.
- The Board will act as ambassadors of Columbus Metropolitan Library, Friends of the Library, and the library in the community.
- Board members will help identify and facilitate the introduction and cultivation of key partners, donors, community leaders, and future board members.
